

### **Annual Beach Run**

**13 January 2013**

Trip leader Peter Andruszkiw

After Peter's trip briefing and welcome to three guests 17 cars left the meeting point at 8:55 for a short drive to Tim's Thicket beach. We stopped at the Miami Bakehouse where some people bought supplies for the day and to meet another car joining the trip. Yet another car was waiting to join us further down the road before turning off onto Tim's Thicket Road. Peter then issued something of a challenge by instructing us to drive to our morning tea stop about 1 km along the beach without deflating tyres. Keeping up the momentum using second gear at 3000 rpm

allowed us to get there or at least most of the way. This was a good illustration to all of us of what Subarus can do but the obvious smell of hard worked engines and clutches showed this isn't a good idea for extended driving. Continuing south along the beach was not possible here because it narrowed too much at a rock outcrop. During the tea stop tyres were deflated to 15 psi for an easy drive back to Tim's Thicket Road for tyre re-inflation.

An enlarged convoy of 19 cars continued south to Myalup some-times extending over 5 km because of traffic lights. This made communication between head and tail of the convoy difficult, especially with hand held

radios. At Myalup a third car joined up and tyres were deflated to 15 psi before 20 cars headed north along the beach. Easy driving allowed us to "break convoy" and try driving in different sand conditions. The sand was very squeaky causing speculation about tyres slipping and various underbody scrapings. It was definitely the sand,

driving in flat, dry, clean and undisturbed sand (not easy to find) resulted in a continuous squeal. The cars lined up for the lunch stop after about 15 km at a wider section of beach. The water was

very calm, the weather cloudy and mild; just right for a relaxed lunch along with some swimming and fishing using assorted lures. Fish caught were 3 whiting, 2 her-ring 1 tailor, and 1 blowfish. All fish were re-leased for an environmentally neutral session.

Continuing north after lunch some softer patches of sand made conditions more variable. Charlie was concerned

about his tyres and stopped for inspection but saw no problems. We reached Preston's Beach without major incidents and four cars left the trip to return to other commitments. Pressing on, the track was much more worn from heavier traffic and more fishing groups were evident along the beach. Some very soft sand patches were more challenging needing good technique to negotiate. There were more displays of exhibitionist driving in these conditions. Charlie's Forester seemed to be having a lot of fun sliding around and spraying sand until a particularly spectacular slide ended with the discovery of a flat front tyre. The tyre was very hot and badly deformed. Changing the wheel gave a demonstration of how to do it in soft

conditions and the opportunity of a break and afternoon tea stop. A short drive then took us to the While Hills Road where we left the beach not too far from the Tim's Thicket morning stop. Tyres were pumped up and cars left for home at their leisure. Thanks to Peter for organising a very enjoyable day.

## **CAMPFIRE SAFETY PRESENTATION**

David gave a presentation on this topic at the January General meeting. The material came from the “Queensland Fire and Rescue Service”. Development of the material was partly stimulated by an increase in the number of children suffering burns from campfires—generally the morning after a night time campfire.

Five rules are included in the material:

- 1** Fires should be lit in cleared areas, where there are no overhanging branches and minimal grass and scrub.
- 2** Ensure the campfire is a safe distance from tents, and that any other camping equipment is stored well away from it - especially flammable items such as gas cylinders, fuel cans etc.
- 3** Where possible use a fireplace such as a barbeque pit or build a surround out of large rocks.
- 4** Never use any kind of flammable liquid on a fire – even when you are trying to get it started.
- 5** Put your campfire out with water when you have finished with it.

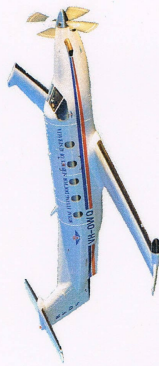
